3. Presentation by Danielle Pritchett

- Key Points from Danielle Pritchett's Presentation
- Introduction to Genealogy and Newspapers
 - 1. Danielle emphasized the importance of newspapers in uncovering juicy details about family history.
 - She shared intriguing stories from her own family history, including the case of Mona Lisa Abney, James Donald Pritchett, Margie Pritchett Martin, and her grandfather Willie James Watkins Sr.
- Using Newspapers for Genealogical Research
 - 1. Newspapers are a valuable resource for finding information that might be left out in family stories.
 - 2. Danielle discussed various newspaper databases and resources, including historic North Carolina newspaper collection, NEWSBANK, New York Times, chronicling America, digital NC, Google News, newspapers.com, newspaperarchive.com, genealogybank.com, and MyHeritage.com.

• Tips for Searching Newspapers

- 1. Danielle provided tips for effectively searching newspapers, such as using wild card and Boolean search techniques, searching specific locations, spelling variations, initials, name abbreviations, and addresses.
- 2. She emphasized the importance of manually browsing newspapers and using multiple newspaper databases for comprehensive research.
- Case Studies from Danielle's Family

- 1. Danielle shared several case studies from her family history, highlighting the use of newspapers and DNA in uncovering details:
 - 1. **Mona Lisa Abney:** Danielle's cousin who was murdered in 1978. The case remained unsolved for 27 years until DNA technology helped identify her husband as the murderer.
 - 2. James Donald Pritchett: Danielle's cousin who murdered a farmer in 1978 and later killed his estranged wife and her boyfriend in 1994.
 - 3. **Margie Pritchett Martin**: Danielle's great aunt who died in an elevator mishap at a tobacco factory. The circumstances of her death were investigated and revealed different versions of the story.
 - 4. Willie James Watkins Sr.: Danielle's grandfather whose true parentage was uncovered through DNA testing, revealing a connection to Isaac Banks.

• Using DNA for Genealogical Research

- 1. Danielle discussed the importance of DNA testing in genealogy, especially for adoptees and uncovering hidden family stories.
- 2. She shared her own experience of using DNA to uncover the true parentage of her grandfather, Willie James Watkins Sr.

- 1. Danielle offered assistance to anyone interested in navigating newspapers, DNA, or other genealogical questions.
- 2. She encouraged participants to reach out to her for virtual appointments and further guidance.
