Biography

Tamika Strong is a librarian, genealogist and archivist who has a love for sharing information. Mrs. Strong has been studying African American history and culture for nearly 30 years. She has been tracing African American roots for the past 20 years. She spent 15 years serving Georgia's citizens as a librarian in the DeKalb County Public Library System and the Georgia Public Library Service. In 2017, she became a Reference Archivist at the Georgia Archives and served the visiting researchers for more than six years, specializing in family history research. As a genealogist and instructor, she has presented on a national, state and local level at a variety of institutions, including her Alma Mater Emory University. She is also active in several genealogy groups. Mrs. Strong currently serves as the Reference and Research Division Manager at the Auburn Avenue Research Library on African American Culture and History (AARL), a Special Library of the Fulton County Library System. There she leads a team of librarians responsible for assisting visiting researchers on a variety of topics. She holds a Bachelor's in African American Studies from Emory University; a Master's of Library and Information Science from the University of Pittsburgh and a Master's of Archival Studies from Clayton State University.
